



AFTER ULVERAL INACTIVE YEARS, THE SOCIETY WAS RESURRECTED IN 1942 UNDER ITS OLD NAME AND TURNED TO PRESERVING HISTORIC LANDWARKA, PUBLISHING A BOOKLET IN 1931 OF THE ISLAND'S SIGNIFICANT HOMES. IN 1954, ONE OF THOSE HOMES, THE 1630, WHEAMS TUCKER HOUSE, WAS THREATENED. THE SOCIETY, UNAME BY ITS CHARTER TO ACQUIRE PROPERTY, FORMED A NEW OROUP, THE GALVESTON HISTORICAL FOUNDATION, WHICH FUICHASED THE HOME AND RESTORED IT. IN 1959, THE TWO GROUPS HERGED AS THE GALVESTON HISTORICAL FOUNDATION. OVER THE HERT SO YEARS, THE GROUP SAVED BUILDINGS AND HELFED ESTABLISH HISTORIC DISTRICTS, INCLUDING THE STRAND, ONE OF THE LARGEST EXTANT VICTORIAN BUSINESS DISTRICTS IN THE SOUTH
